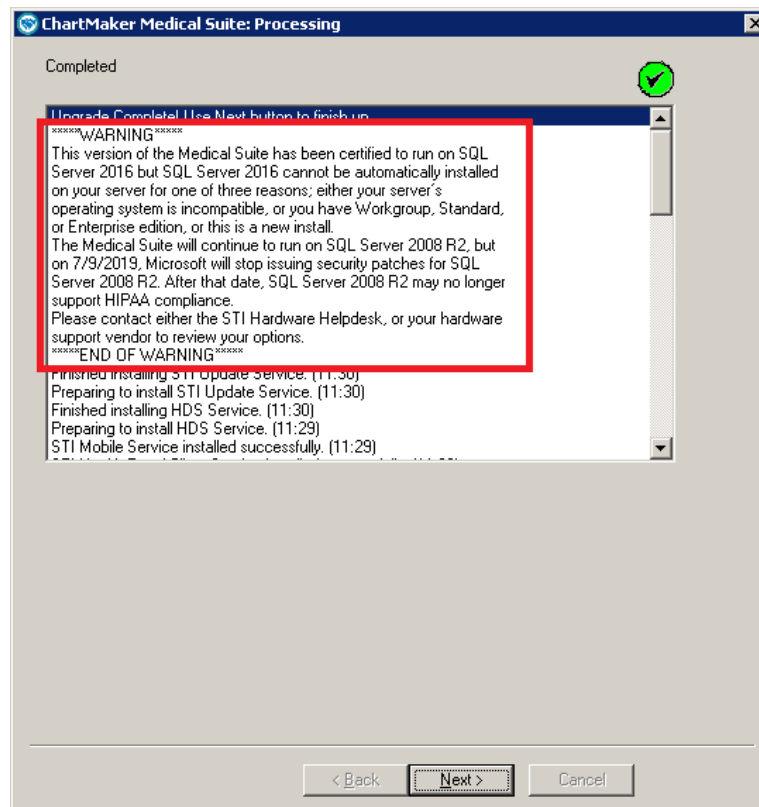


ChartMaker® Practice Manager Release Notes

ChartMaker® 2022.1 (fv6.7.7)

Important Notifications

- **Upgrade from Microsoft Server 2008/2012 and Windows 7/8** – Since January 2020, your **Windows 7/8** workstations and **Microsoft 2008 Servers** are no longer supported. Likewise, support for **Windows 8.1** will end on January 10, 2023, and support for **Windows Server 2012/2012R2** will end on October 10, 2023. Even with security patches, problems may still arise if you choose not to upgrade. In addition, your workstations are not HIPAA compliant. To avoid these issues, contact our [Technical Services Department](#) today.
- **SQL Server 2016 & the ChartMaker 2018.2 (File Version 6.3.3) Upgrade** – Beginning with ChartMaker 2018.2 (File Version 6.3.3) Upgrade, a warning message will appear upon the completion of the upgrade regarding the transition of the ChartMaker Medical Suite to using SQL Server 2016, for those offices where an automated upgrade to SQL Server 2016 was not possible. See the figure below. If you are receiving this message, to avoid potential issues and to ensure your system remains HIPAA compliant, it is important to contact either STI Hardware Helpdesk, or your software vendor, to review your options.

Charge

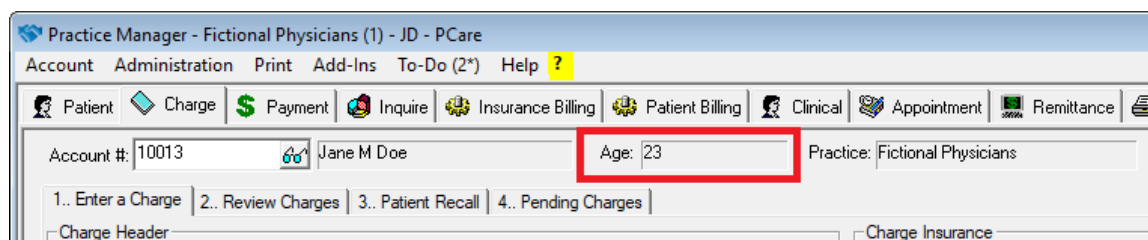


Figure 1 – Charge – Age

- **Charge** – The Charge screen has been updated with a new **Age** field that will display the selected patient's age. See Figure 1. This new field is between the patient's name and the Practice field, and how the age will be displayed is based on how the **Age Formatting** preferences are configured in the **General Behavior** tab of the **Maintain System/Practice/Operator Preferences** area (Administration > Preferences System/Practice/Operator Level Preferences).

- **Clinical – Immunization** – The program has been updated to ensure that the latest CVX codes and CVX mappings, MVX codes and MVX mappings, Manufacturers, and NDC codes, per the latest CDC guidelines, are used for immunization procedures.
