Inspired by Simple Gifts: A Series of Devotions on Stewardship



After Hurricane Hilary came through and hit Los Angeles on Sunday, I looked out my window on Monday afternoon to see a bright blue sky. I couldn't help but smile at this beautiful day outside and realize only a little while before we had been in darkness and bracing for the worst.

Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. For behold, darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will be seen upon you." (Isaiah. 60:1–2)

This passage rang especially true for me looking out my window. We

were in darkness and now we see the light. God's



simple gift of light gives us life and leads us to the light of Jesus and to our salvation. Others may be still in the darkness; living through the aftermath of Hilary, the aftermath of the devastating fires in Maui, or even just personal darkness that can be hard to shake. 

#### Church **Council highlights** July 18, 2023 mtg in person! Council


◆ Pastor's Report: Pastor Utecht reported that his

- ◆ President's Report: David Seaver will be on a mission trip to Africa with Adam Yenser.
- ◆ Vice President's Report: Dick Robertson gave an update on the 24 Hour Fitness Center advertising. The Fitness Center is not a family crowd, no parents are there for VBS information. Dick and Pastor will start visits to those who have not attended church in a while to encourage them back.
- ◆ Elder's Report: Dick Robertson reported for Luigi who stated all Elders are being held accountable to reach out to those on their list to increase church attendance.

- ◆ Stewardship Committee Report: Laura Murcott purchased the books recommended by Pastor. The committee has not met yet.



### A Message from Pastor...

### The Peacemaker: A Loooong Study

This month, shortly after Rally Day, we will be offering a Bible study course on biblical principles of peacemaking. We will be using a video based series led by Ken Sande, author of *The Peacemaker* and personal hero of mine. I am very eager and excited for this course, and I hope you will be able to join in one way or another. (We are still working out the details on the specific format for the course, but I'm working hard to make it available to make sure that

you can take the course regardless of your life circumstances right now.)

The reason for my eagerness is that this material has had a profound positive impact on my life. My marriage, my relationship with my kids, friends, fellow church members, and just about every single meaningful relationship I have has greatly benefited from learning and applying these principles. It's one of the most practical, transformative, and also deeply biblical studies I've encountered.

That said, it's also one of the longest studies I've led at church: 12 weeks. So it is about as long as a semester at school. Perhaps that might be a little intimidating, but it does actually bring out a fairly important point: real growth and transformation requires time and discipline. If a person could gain the heart and skills of a peacemaker over the course of half an hour, we would be offering that version instead. But the reality is, transformation and growth take time.

Moreover, it turns out that the process of becoming a complete peacemaker is more than 12 weeks. Much longer. In fact, I'm pretty sure it takes a lifetime. Earlier I said

that my life has been radically improved by learning this material. In reality, it is far more accurate to say my life has been improved insofar as I have implemented these peacemaking principles. The truth is, there are all sorts of areas where I still act as a "peace-faker" or a "peace-breaker" rather than a peacemaker. Just within the last couple of weeks there have been a couple of instances where I have not lived as a

> peacemaker and have been reminded of how much I need to continue to implement and grow! I find in that a good picture of the life of Christian discipleship.

On one hand, try as I may there is so much sin and weakness in me that still needs to be addressed. In those moments I rest on God's grace and ask for God to forgive and strengthen me. On the other hand,

there has been real growth in this area for me and it has been an incredible blessing. That is the life of Christian discipleship: continual repentance and continual growth. We never graduate from needing God's grace, but by God's grace real growth and change can and do happen.

I pray that starting this month, you would undertake a long study in peacemaking. Not simply a 12 week study that comes to a neat and tidy end in December, but a lifelong process of letting the transformative and healing power of the Gospel of reconciliation take hold in your life. I pray that this may be true not just in the area of peacemaking, but in all of God's teaching. Amen.
