

The theory advanced at the time was that they had a car which they had parked a short distance from the gas station while they waited the right moment at which to attempt to

hold up Opperhauer. According to the description of the three given to the police one of them was in shirt sleeves at the time. Another was dressed in dark clothes and carried a gun and was the one who did most of the talking and actual struggling. Opperhauer stated that he smelt liquor on this man's breath. The third was dressed in a light grey suit.

All three wore caps. Police in the precincts of the city were notified of the affair a few minutes after it occurred and watched for the men. No signs of their whereabouts






