You probably recall the opening line of this hymn of thanksgiving and praise from our hymnal (#87 if you'd like to read further). As we live through the Advent season and prepare for the coming Christmas celebration of the birth of Jesus so long ago, we find ourselves on the shoulders of many who brought their gifts of faith, service, and praise! This is the last month of our congregation before it turns 100 years old. Imagine that! 100 years of ministry, service, and praise–changing the lives of others and being a become of love, justice, and healing for our community and the world. Imagine the lives that the people of Northridge UMC have touched as one transformed life brings joy and healing to another...and so on...

May your Advent and Christmas seasons be filled with the joy of the Lord as you offer yourselves to God.

Pastor's Corner

A Redeemed Community That Is Valued by God

There was a Christian in the United States named Fiorello La Guardia (1933-1945), who was a judge in a New York court.

One day, he was judging an old man who had been caught stealing bread. Guardia asked the old man, "Sir, how did you end up stealing someone else's bread?" The old man, who was dressed in shabby clothes, replied, "I'm sorry. I know it's wrong to touch what belongs to others, but my young grandson was starving, so I did so without realizing it." Hearing that, the judge's heart broke, but he had no choice but to fulfill his responsibility as a judge: "Sir, your situation is unfortunate, but I have to make a judgment. According to the law, I sentence you to a fine of \$10." (In those days, a \$10 fine was worth about \$200 fine in today's dollars). The judge then took a \$10 bill out of his own pocket, handed it to the old man, and said, "This is your fine. Please pay it with this money." He then addresses the townspeople gathered in the courtroom. "I'm going to fine everybody in this courtroom 50 cents each, because you are neighbors of this old man who had to steal bread to feed his hungry grandson. You are all responsible for leaving the old man and his grandchild hungry." With that, the judge collected the fines from the audience and handed the \$47 to the old man. Amazingly, no one complained or protested the ruling. In fact, they elected Guardia as mayor of New York City three times. Guardia had done a small act of love, and the people of New York responded with a big act of love.

This is the kind of community of faith Jesus was talking about. And this kind of blessing is God's way of governing the world. When we share a little, God fills us up to share more.

Brothers and Sisters, there are many places that need our help right now. If we're going to help them, the church needs to be strong - not just financially, but in terms of dedicated volunteers.

Next year, Northridge Church will be 100 years old. As the year passes, I reflect on whether I have been an unashamed pastor to the countless ancestors of faith who have stood by this church. I have fervent hope that next year, our centennial year, we will be a happier church and a more joyful church going forward. Most of all, I pray every day that we will be a beautiful church in God's eyes, a gospel church, and a soul-saving church.

May we all work together to build this church that has been handed down to us by our ancestors into a beautiful church of love, and may we be an ancestor of faith that posterity will not be ashamed of.

May we, Northridge Church, be a beautiful church that is being built as a community of salvation that is treasured and used by God, in the name of the Lord.

All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need (Acts 2:44–45). –Ralph Kwon (Associate Pastor)

Staff Parish Relations Committee welcomed October 1st to our NUMC staff, Mezzo-Soprano, Monika Bruckner as NUMC's Alto Chancel Choir Section Leader/Soloist. Monika is originally from Munich, Germany. She moved to Paris, where she earned her degree in vocal performance at the Conservatory of Boulogne-Billancourt. Shortly after she became a permanent member of the Radio France Choir and sang many under the baton of conductors such as Seiji Ozawa, Jeffrey Tate and Myun-Whun Chung.

In Paris she was also member of the experimental vocal octet, "Oct'opus" and the Renaissance music ensemble "Il Sonnetto Musicale." In 2002, she relocated to Los Angeles, and has since been

performing, among others, with the Los Angeles Master Chorale, the Los Angeles Opera Chorus, and the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra. Monika's solo performances include works such as Handel's Messiah, the Mozart Requiem, and Bach's Mass in B-Minor. Monika is also an accomplished voice teacher, offering her expertise to vocalists of all musical styles at her private studio as well as online.

Korean Ministry



하나님께 소중한 쓰임을 받는 구원의 공동체

미국에 피오렐로 갈디아 (Fiorello La Guardia, 1933~1945) 라는 그리스도인이 있었습니다. 그는 뉴욕 법정의 판사였습니다.

하루는 빵을 훔치다가 잡혀 온 한 노인을 심판하게 되었습니다. 갈디아는 노인에게 "어르신, 어쩌다가 남의 빵을 훔치게 되었습니까?"라고 질문을 했습니다. 그러자, 허름한 옷을 입고 있던 노인이 "죄송합니다. 남의 것에 손을 대는 것이 잘못인 줄은 알지만, 어린 손자가 굶고 있어서 저도 모르게 그런 짓을 저질렀습니다"라고 말했습니다. 그 말을 들은 판사는 마음이 아팠지만, 판사로서 책임을 다할 수 밖에 없었습니다. "어르신, 어르신의 사정은 딱하지만 저는 판결을 내려야만 합니다. 법에 따라 10 달러의 벌금형을 선고합니다." (그 때에 10 달러는 지금 가치로 보면 200 달러 정도 되는 벌금입니다.) 그리고는 그 판사는 자기 주머니에서 10 달러짜리 지폐를 꺼내 그 노인에게 드리며, "이 돈은 어르신이 낼 벌금입니다. 이 돈으로 벌금을 내십시오." 그리고 법정에 모인 마을 사람들에게도 판결을 내립니다. "이 법정에 참석한 모든 방청객들에게 벌금 50 센트씩 부과하겠습니다. 그 이유는 배고픈 손자를 먹이기 위해 빵을 훔쳐야만 했던 이 어르신의 이웃이기 때문입니다. 어르신과 아이를 배고프게 방치한 여러분에게도 책임이 있습니다"그 말과 함께 판사는 방청객들에게 벌금을 거두었고, 47 달러의 벌금을 노인에게 전달했다고 했습니다. 그런데 놀라운 것은 어느 누구도 그 판결에 불평하거나 항의하는 사람이 없었습니다. 오히려 그들은 그 갈디아 판사를 뉴욕시장으로 세 번이나 당선시켜 주었습니다. 갈디아는 작은 사랑을 베풀었을 뿐인데, 뉴욕 시민들은 큰 사랑으로 보답한 것입니다. 이것이 바로 예수님이 말씀하신 믿음의 공동체의 모습입니다. 또한, 이러한 축복은 세상을 다스리시는 하나님의 섭리입니다. 작은 것을 나눌 때, 더 많은 것을 나눌 수 있도록 채워 주시는 하나님이십니다.

여러분, 지금 많은 곳에서 우리의 도움의 손길을 기다리고 있습니다. 우리가 그들에게 도움을 주려면 교회가 튼튼해야 합니다. 재정 뿐만 아니라, 헌신하시는 봉사자도 필요합니다.

내년이면, Northridge 교회가 100 살이 되는 뜻 깊은 해입니다. 저는 한해를 지나면서 이 교회를 지켜온 무수한 믿음의 선조들에게 부끄러움이 없는 목사였는지 제 자신을 돌아 봅니다. 저는 100 주년이 되는 내년에는 지금보다 더 행복한 교회, 기쁨이 넘치는 교회가 되기를 간절히 소망하고 있습니다. 무엇보다, 하나님께서 보시기에 아름다운 복음의 교회, 영혼을 살리는 교회가 되기를 매일 기도합니다.

우리 모두 힘을 합쳐 믿음의 선조들이 우리에게 물려 준 이 교회를 아름다운 사랑의 교회로 세워 나가며 후손들에게 부끄럽지 않는 믿음의 선조가 되기를 소망합니다.

바라옵기는, 우리 노스리지 교회가 하나님께 소중히 쓰임을 받는 구원의 공동체로 세워져 나가는 아름다운 교회가 되기를 주님의 이름으로 축복합니다.
