Part One - English Listening Practice:

In the first part, you'll listen to a conversation between native English speakers. Try to focus on the meaning of the conversation when you listen to it. This will help you understand real-life conversations better.

Shopping for a jacket

Sarah: Hi there! How can I help you today?

Alex: Hi! I'm looking for a new jacket.

Sarah: Sure! What kind of jacket are you looking for?

Alex: Something casual. Maybe black or blue.

Sarah: We have some nice ones over here. What size do you wear?

Alex: Medium, I think. Can I try this one on?

Sarah: Of course. The fitting room is right over there.

Alex: Thanks. (A few minutes later) It fits well, but do you have it in blue?

Sarah: Let me check... Yes, here it is in blue.

Alex: Nice! I like the color. How much is it?

Sarah: It's \$49.99, but it's on sale today—20% off.

Alex: That's a good deal. I'll take it.

Sarah: Great! Would you like anything else? Maybe a shirt to go with it?

Alex: Hmm, good idea. Do you have plain white shirts?

Sarah: Yes, right this way. They're also on sale.

Alex: This one looks nice. I'll take it too.

Sarah: Perfect! Will you pay by cash or card?

Part Two - Learn Vocabulary:

Now, let's explore some new words together in our vocabulary section. I'll explain a few words and use them in example sentences to help you grasp their meaning easily.

Vocabulary

Try on: To put on clothes to see if they fit or look good.

Example: I want to try on this jacket before I buy it.

On sale: The price is lower than usual.

Example: This shirt is on sale. It's only \$10 now.

Go with it: To look good together with something.

Example: This white shirt will **go with your new jacket**.

Receipt: A piece of paper that shows what you bought and how much you paid.

Example: Here's your **receipt**. Please keep it.

I want to remind you something guys. Repetition is very important to become fluent in English. So, watch this video many times. Try to answer the questions out loud, and you will improve your speaking skills quickly.

Part Three - Listen and Answer Practice:

Time for some interactive practice! Listen carefully to the questions I ask about the conversation. Try to answer them out loud before I reveal the correct answers. This will boost your speaking and listening skills. Repeat this exercise every day until you can say the answers quickly and confidently.

Answer the questions out loud!

Sarah: **Hi there! How can I help you today?**

Did Sarah ask Alex if he needed help?

Yes, she did. She asked him, "How can I help you today?"

Who are Sarah and Alex?

Sarah is a shop assistant and Alex is a customer.

Alex: Hi! I'm looking for a new jacket.

Was Alex looking for pants?

No, he wasn't looking for pants.

What was Alex looking for?

A new jacket. He was looking for a new jacket.

Sarah: Sure! What kind of jacket are you looking for?

Alex: Something casual. Maybe black or blue.

Did Alex want a fancy jacket?

No, he didn't. He wanted something casual.

What color jacket did Alex want?

Black or blue. He wanted a black or blue jacket.

Sarah: We have some nice ones over here. What size do you wear?

Alex: Medium, I think. Can I try this one on?

Did Sarah show Alex some jackets?

Yes, she did. She showed him some jackets.

Does Alex wear a large size?

No, he doesn't wear a large size.

What size does Alex wear?

Medium. He wears a medium size.

Sarah: Of course. The fitting room is right over there.

Alex: Thanks.

Did Alex try on the jacket?

Yes, he did. He tried it on in the fitting room.

Where is the fitting room?

Over there. Sarah said the fitting room is right over there.

Alex: It fits well, but do you have it in blue?

Sarah: Let me check... Yes, here it is in blue.

Did Alex like the first jacket?

Yes, he did. But he wanted it in blue.

Did Sarah have the jacket in blue?

Yes, she did. She gave him the jacket in blue.

Alex: Nice! I like the color. How much is it?

Sarah: It's \$49.99, but it's on sale today—20% off.

Alex: That's a good deal. I'll take it.

Was the jacket one thousand dollars?

No, it wasn't. The jacket wasn't one thousand dollars.

How much was the jacket?

\$49.99. But it was 20% off.

Did Alex buy the jacket?

Yes, he did. He bought the jacket.

Sarah: Great! Would you like anything else? Maybe a shirt to go with it?

Did Sarah ask if Alex wanted anything else?

Yes, she did. She asked if he wanted a shirt to go with the jacket.

Alex: Hmm, good idea. Do you have plain white shirts?

Sarah: Yes, right this way. They're also on sale.

What kind of shirt did Alex want?

A plain white shirt. He wanted a plain white one.

Alex: **This one looks nice. I'll take it too.**

Did Alex take the shirt too?

Yes, he did. He took the shirt.

Sarah: **Perfect! Will you pay by cash or card?**

Alex: **Card, please.**

Sarah: **All right. Here's your receipt. Thank you and have a great day!**

Alex: **Thanks! You too!**

How did Alex pay?

By card. He paid by card.

Part Four - Shadowing Practice:

Lastly, we have the shadowing practice. Read your lines out loud after the speakers as they talk in the conversation. Focus on the rhythm and intonation of the English expressions and sentences. This exercise will sharpen your pronunciation and overall speaking abilities. Let's begin!
