

10 of the 16 existing operating rooms have been approved for renovation! Each of the ten rooms has been evaluated and priortized based on the current state of the infrastructure, including HVAC, electrical, IT, and equipment/technology needs. The perioperative leadership team is working closely with the planning, design and construction teams, as well as the nursing, anesthesiology and surgical leaders, to ensure all aspects of the project are successful. *Design* of the new rooms should be complete in July 2022, with *permitting* and *purchasing* of equpiment following soon thereafter. *Construction* is tentatively scheduled to begin in January 2023.
