This bill provides for grounds for involuntary termination in juvenile matters.

This bill amends Title 50 to provide protections for minors using social media and imposing penalties.

HOUSE 657 An Act providing for transparency in realty agreements; requiring and prohibiting certain provisions in realty agreements; prohibiting 2725 unfair real estate service agreements; and imposing penalties. This bill provides for consumer protection against unfair realty agreements.

An Act amending Title 67 (Public Welfare) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in family finding and kinship care, 1297 establishing the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant **Program and the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant** Program Account; and making a transfer. (Representatives PASHINSKI, SANCHEZ, HILL-EVANS and others) - Human Services, **December 10, 2023** 12

This bill amends Title 67 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes to establish the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program and the Legal Services for Kinship Care Families Grant Program Account.

This bill provides for disclosures and standardized terms in pet insurance contracts.

This bill requires dental insurers to provide dentists with multiple payment methods.

This bill amends Title 42 to create a medical parole process to allow incarcerated individuals with serious medical conditions including terminal illness to apply for release.

HOUSE 1441 1625 An Act amending the act of April 6, 1951 (P.L.69, No.20), known as The Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951, providing for tenants' rights in cases of violence. (Representatives BOROWSKI, SCHLOSSBERG, KINSEY and others) – Judiciary, December 12, 2023 10

This bill amends the Landlord Tenant Act to allow victims of domestic violence to change locks or terminate a lease.

HOUSE 961 2439 An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in preliminary provisions, providing for county property contact information list; imposing duties on chief assessors; and providing for penalties. This bill amends Title 68 to require individuals and businesses to submit basic information to counties when purchasing real property within the county.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in licensing of drivers, further providing for learners' permits and for examination of applicant for driver's license; in rules of the road in general, further providing for prohibiting text-based communications and providing for prohibiting use of interactive mobile device; in miscellaneous provisions relating to serious traffic offenses, further providing for the offense of homicide by vehicle and for the offense of aggravated assault by vehicle; in enforcement, providing for data collection and reporting relating to traffic stops; and imposing penalties. (Senators BROWN, LANGERHOLC, FLYNN and others) - Transportation, March 27, 2024 1

This bill provides for prohibiting the use of interactive mobile devices while driving.



This bill provides certifying agencies with clarity and consistency for providing nonimmigrant victims with documentation to use when applying for a U Visa.


