SECOND CONSIDERATION CHILDREN & YOUTH BILL

An Act amending Titles 23 (Domestic Relations) and 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in proceedings prior to petition to adopt, further providing for grounds for involuntary termination; and, in juvenile matters, further providing for disposition of dependent child. (Representatives KRAJEWSKI, KINSEY, CONKLIN and others) - Children & Youth, March 27, 2024

OVER

This bill provides for grounds for involuntary termination in juvenile matters.

SECOND CONSIDERATION CONSUMER PROTECTION, TECHNOLOGY AND UTILITIES BILL

HOUSE 2017

An Act amending Title 50 (Mental Health) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for protection of minors on social media; and imposing penalties. (Representatives MUNROE, DONAHUE, BOROWSKI and others) – Consumer Protection, Technology & Utilities, March 25, 2024

OVER

This bill amends Title 50 to provide protections for minors using social media and imposing penalties.

SECOND CONSIDERATION EDUCATION BILL

HOUSE 1743

An Act amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, in school directors, further providing for school director training programs. (Representatives MADDEN, PROBST, HILL-EVANS and others) - Education, January 2, 2024

OVER

This bill enhances and makes more efficient the training of elected school board officials.

SECOND CONSIDERATION HEALTH BILLS

HOUSE 1657

An Act amending the act of June 13, 2008 (P.L.182, No.27), known as the Clean Indoor Air Act, further providing for title of act, for definitions, for prohibition, for signage, for enforcement, for preemption of local ordinances and for repeal; and making editorial changes. (Representatives FRANKEL, RABB, D. WILLIAMS and others) – Health, April 17, 2024

OVER

This bill protects Pennsylvania's workers, patrons and clients from secondhand smoke by closing loopholes in the Clean Indoor Air Act.

HOUSE **2084**

An Act amending the act of December 14, 1992 (P.L.1116, No.145), known as the Wholesale Prescription Drug Distributors License Act, further providing for definitions, for license application and for storage, handling and recordkeeping. (Representatives BRIGGS, SANCHEZ, HILL-EVANS and others) – Health, April 17, 2024

VOTE

This bill adds virtual manufacturing to the list of distributors licensed by the Wholesale Prescription Drugs Distributor License Act.

SECOND CONSIDERATION INSURANCE BILL

HOUSE **2096** 2677

An Act amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, in surplus lines, providing for surplus lines fees and further providing for monthly reports. (Representatives WARREN AND PICKETT) - Insurance, April 17, 2024

VOTE

This bill ensures continued access to the personal surplus lines insurance market and caps a service fee for policy placement services.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **JUDICIARY BILL**

HOUSE 1806

An Act amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, in public assistance, further providing for false statements, investigations and penalty; and imposing penalties. (Representatives MAYES, D. MILLER, MADDEN and others) - Judiciary, April 17, 2024

OVER

This bill increases the grading thresholds for welfare fraud to allow the Office of Inspector General to pursue a greater number of cases at the Magisterial District Justice level.

SECOND CONSIDERATION LOCAL GOVERNMENT BILL

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 68 (Real and Personal Property) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in preliminary provisions, providing for county property contact information list; imposing duties on chief assessors; and providing for penalties. (Representatives SOLOMON, MERSKI, SIEGEL and others) - Local Government, March 19, 2024

OVER

This bill amends Title 68 to require individuals and businesses to submit basic information to counties when purchasing real property within the county.

SECOND CONSIDERATION TRANSPORTATION BILL

HOUSE

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania **Consolidated Statutes, in inspection of vehicles, further providing** 2867 for inspection of motorcycles. (Representatives MULLINS, BENNINGHOFF, GUENST and others) - Transportation, April 17, 2024



This bill provides for inspection of motorcycles.

SECOND CONSIDERATION **VETERANS AFFAIRS & EMERGENCY PREP. BILL**

HOUSE

An Act amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, in interpretation and definitions, further providing for definitions; and, in liability and compensation, providing for compensation for post-traumatic stress injury. (Representatives O'MARA, SOLOMON, GILLEN and others) - Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness, April 17, 2024

OVER

This bill establishes that first responders may collect workers' compensation for post-traumatic stress injuries sustained in the course and scope of their work.

THIRD CONSIDERATION AND FINAL PASSAGE JUDICIARY BILL

HOUSE 1371

An Act providing for duties of certifying officials and certifying agencies regarding the processing of certification form petitions. 2788 (Representatives HOHENSTEIN, MIHALEK, **BURGOS** others) - Appropriations, March 26, 2024 **Fiscal-Note Attached**

OVER

This bill provides certifying agencies with clarity and consistency for providing nonimmigrant victims with documentation to use when applying for a U Visa.

THIRD CONSIDERATION AND FINAL PASSAGE LABOR & INDUSTRY BILL

HOUSE 181

An Act establishing the Family and Medical Leave Program and the Family and Medical Leave Fund; conferring powers and 2445 imposing duties on the Department of Labor and Industry; and imposing penalties. (Representatives D. MILLER, BENHAM, SCHLOSSBERG and others) - Appropriations, December 13, 2023 **Fiscal-Note Attached** 15

OVER

This bill establishes Paid Family and Medical Leave program.

THIRD CONSIDERATION AND FINAL PASSAGE TRANSPORTATION BILL

SENATE 656

An Act amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in liquid fuels and fuels tax, further providing for definitions and for imposition of tax, exemptions and deductions and providing for electric vehicle road user charge; and imposing DUSH. penalty. (Senators ROTHMAN. AND WARD) - Appropriations, 2024 Fiscal-Note April 10. Attached

OVER

This bill imposes an annual fee of \$290 per year on certain noncommercial passenger electric vehicles and provides for the Alternative Fuels Tax on Electricity.
