Steps To Being A Host Employer

1. Contact us to register your interest to host a student.
2. Chat with our team about your availability to host students.
3. We connect you with your local Work Placement Service Provider to complete required documentation.
4. Student allocations are confirmed and communicated to you.
5. Your team provide supervised work placement.
6. We check in to ensure the placement is running smoothly for both you and your student.
