From death into a newfound life: From bondage freed, from harm released, From illness healed, as one in peace. When all is lost our hearts are warmed, Our hope restored, our lives transformed. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

Leader: Mary Magdalene made her way to the tomb, not expecting to see the stone rolled away from the entrance... *Reader:* We sometimes simply accept the dead-ends of life, and expect that closed doors are closed forever.

Leader: She ran back to get Simon Peter and another disciple, thinking that Jesus' body had been stolen, taken away... *Reader:* Expecting the worst is often our first thought.

Leader: They ran to the tomb and went inside, seeing the linens left behind... *Reader:* We sometimes see only the evidence that backs up our worst fears, that feeds our imagined terrors.

Leader: The two disciples went home but Mary stayed at the tomb, crying... *Reader:* Trying to escape our pain, we sometimes leave it too soon, not allowing love to show us an upside to the story.

Leader: She exclaimed, "Teacher!" and after seeing it was indeed her very-alive friend, she ran to tell the disciples "I have seen the Lord!" ...

We open this day to the possibilities still in play, that new beginnings can happen in the midst of what feels like endings, and resurrection from death-dealing forces is possible.

Leader: This is a Word of Life for the people who long for it. Thanks be to the Living Word.
