#### A READING FROM HEBREWS 12:18-29

#### Reader: A Reading from Hebrews.

You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. (For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death." Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear.") But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven." This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of what is shaken-- that is, created things-- so that what cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; for indeed our God is a consuming fire.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. **People:** Thanks be to God.



THE GOSPEL Luke 13:10-17

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Now Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. And just then there appeared a woman with a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years. She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, "Woman, you are set free from your ailment." When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured, and not on the sabbath day." But the Lord answered him and said, "You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water? And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen long years, be set free from this bondage on the sabbath day?" When he said this, all his opponents were put to shame; and the entire crowd was rejoicing at all the wonderful things that he was doing.

#### The 2022 Parish Retreat - September 29th

Christ Church's Annual Rehoboth Retreat will be again held at the Felix DuPont Retreat House in Rehoboth Beach, Delaware from September 30th to October 2nd. We are very blessed to have the Rev Marcia Davenport as our retreat leader, and we'll be centering on the Christ Church theme for the coming year: *Be an Instrument of God's Peace*. There will be interactive programs filled with discussions and music on Friday evening, Saturday morning, and Saturday evening. Evening Prayer service or Compline will be celebrated on Friday and Saturday evenings, and we'll conclude with a special Eucharist in the Chapel on Sunday morning. There is also free time for all scheduled on Saturday afternoon. Beach walks, star gazing, kite flying, art museums, reading and relaxing on the deck, bird watching, and browsing in shops and outlets during our spare time are all possible.

Five delicious meals are provided by an in-house chef for dinner on Friday and Saturday, lunch on Saturday, and breakfast on Saturday and Sunday. We are required to have 15 persons committed to staying at Dupont House in order to host the event. Sign-up by September 4th with full payment is due on arrival to DuPont House on September 30th. # Invitation to Take a Virtual Trip to Uganda as Leaders of Friends of Sabina Join the Sunday Zoom Coffee Hour at Noon on Aug. 21st

Plan to see and hear the latest on how leaders of <u>Friends of Sabina</u> (FOS) are making progress at Sabina Primary School in rural Uganda. At noon on Sunday, Aug. 21, the Outreach Commission will host FOS leaders Maria White, who recently returned from Uganda, and Ann Marie Davis, who went last spring.

The FOS Adult Forum will flow seamlessly from our regular coffee hour. The link to our Zoom gathering is <u>here</u>, the Meeting ID is **830 0557 1585**, and the Password is **SundayVCH**. Or participate as a small group after the second worship service by assembling downstairs in New Brick at the laptop.

Sabina students returned after the pandemic lockdown in Uganda to find many improvements on campus in 2022, such as upgraded sanitation and better dormitories. Currently, the school enrolls 321, consisting of 138 boarding students and 183 day scholars.

Davis described what a difference the upgrades have made for students, teachers, and staff in <u>an April 23</u> <u>letter</u> posted online during her stay from March 10th through May 2nd. White traveled to Sabina from July 18th to Aug. 10th and is eager to tell you about her stay on Zoom.

Some of the latest changes include the introduction of a music program, advances in agriculture, and progress on the new computer lab that you can read about in <u>a July 2, 2022 newsletter</u>.

For more than a decade, the Outreach Commission at Christ Church has backed efforts at the school, especially in a library that serves as a community center. In May, Christ Church sent \$2,000 in Vestry-approved budget funds to pay for internet service, periodicals, and the annual salary of the librarian, Richard Tumusiime. Thanks to all for making that possible!

Outreach also encourages parishioners to sponsor Sabina students whose families otherwise cannot afford fees and tuition (*they are among Sabina students pictured here*). Since 2020, members stepped forward to sponsor nine children, who then ranged in age from 8 to 15. Parishioners and the first names of the students are Steve and Linda Alpern (Sharon); Tim and Sherry Beaty (Herbert and Sylivia); Ellen and Charles Hoke (Josephine); Patricia Fanning (Patricia); Diane Phillips Laguerre (Jackson); Paula and Chuck Rees (Sandra); Catherine Whittaker (Brian); and Melanie and Nick Yaksich (Marvin).

We're hoping sponsors and would-be sponsors will join Zoom to hear about possibilities. And for everyone, seeing the FOS leaders' shared images will be like traveling to Uganda's Central Region, which is west of Lake Victoria and north of the border with Tanzania. For some members of Christ Church – the Hokes, the Alperns, and Teddy and Sonni Aribiah and their sons, Jonah and Luke – it will remind them of their own travels to what is now called the Kyotera District to visit Sabina Primary School.
