Thanksgiving for God's Call of Rev. Joe Nasvyitis and Family to FPC!

On Sunday, May 19, the Assistant Pastor Nominating Committee (Bob Daniels, Chairman, and Edward Kemp, Co-Chairman) presented to the Joint Session-Diaconate Meeting the committee's recommendation that candidate Joe Nasvytis be approved as FPC's new Assistant Pastor for Family Ministries. FPC's officers received the update on Rev. Nasvytis; later last Sunday afternoon, the Session in its Stated May Meeting formally approved the call and provision for the terms of call. Joe is noted for his passion for the Lord, evangelism, and the teaching of God's Word – all of which gifts were evident in his guest-teaching of FPC's New Covenant Class during his visit to our congregation on Mother's Day, May 12.

Now, this month, the Nasvytis family will be moving from San Diego and will then begin a transition period that will lead what the family hopes will be the family's initial move to Starkville either in July or at least by August. In the meantime, Joe will plan to begin his ministry with us by early July.

In addition to the family's move from San Diego to Starkville later in June, Joe will also be looking ahead to preparing for a transition to the EPC from the Christian Reformed Church ("CRC"). In 2015, Joe was ordained in the CRC denomination. Joe has served two CRC congregations: Bethel CRC in Wisconsin as Youth and Family Ministry Leader, and more recently, Living Faith CRC in San Diego, through November 2018. In his new call with us at FPC, Joe will help lead our Family Ministries & Discipleship, as well as assisting Pastor Lifer in a full range of pastoral ministries, worship leadership, and teaching. The AP Nominating Committee and Dr. Lifer will provide further updates for general information at the June 9 Congregational that has been called for the election of two at-large members to the Congregational Nominating Committee.

Remembering all this, let us continue to thank God throughout this month for God's call of Rev. Nasvytis to FPC, and let us further pray for Joe and his wife Ann, as well as their daughters – Grace (10) and Sophie (9). Ask for God's provision, guidance, and strength for Dad, Mom, and daughters, as they pack and prepare to leave their home in California, and as they continue to work seek housing arrangements and their move to Starkville this summer. In addition, please join our church family in extending Christian welcome AND Southern hospitality to Joe, Ann, Grace, and Chloe.

We Thank God Also for the Marriage of FPC Pastoral Intern Reid Roberson and Madeleine Roberson.



Reid and Madeleine Roberson were wed on May 18. God blesses us in bringing these faithful newlyweds to our church family. Reid continues now in the second full month of his ministry as a pastoral intern at FPC.
