Friends & Family, Wednesday Night Fall Study, beginning September 5.



The fall session of the Thursday Women's Bible Study will begin on September 20. This year's study, *The Epic of Eden: Understanding the Old Testament* by Sandra L. Richter, is a 14-session series that will be the subject of both the fall (Peggy Johnson) and spring (Susan Gamel) studies. From the Publisher's Forward to the workbook: "The Old Testament makes up three-fourths of the Bible--a clear majority--and yet it is the least understood part of the Bible. Sandra Richter is one of the finest teachers of the Old Testament in the world.... As a result of engaging with her in this study of the *Old* Testament, you will come to a profound understanding of the *New* Testament and all that Scripture means for your life. She comprehends it from a deep place of faith and understanding and she has learned to teach it to ordinary people in extraordinary ways."




