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Re Kinder Morgan Dear Fellow Friends of Beautiful British Columbis

I oppose this project with every ounce of my soul and all that's left of my energy.

Today I was sent an email from one John Hunter, an engineer who would appear to be in the pay of the other side of the issue however, if I'm wrong on that, as you will see from this excerpt from the letter, he might as well be. It went to a very large list of politicians and journalists.

John Hunter said

"I would also remind residents of three facts that you will never hear from the anti-oil types:
