



An Interconnected Path to Justice

Justice in one system cannot be reached without justice in each system.


- Families unsupported by a child welfare system not working for youth will cause homelessness...
- A economic system that makes education unattainable and offers youth few pathways to a liveable and sustainable wage will cause homelessness...
- A criminal system rooted in punishment and incarceration will continue to criminalize youth and lead to homelessness...
- An immigration system that actively keeps youth in need out of the country and offers them little to no resources when they make it here will lead to homelessness...

...even with the best homeless response system.

How we got here



Community Engagement

- 33 co-creation sessions with youth and older adult partners
- 200+ participants from every region of the country
 - 159 youth and young adult leaders
- one vision for system transformation, rooted in justice



Lessons Learned from Youth Engagement

- We must compensate youth at rates that match the policy work we are asking them to engage with – think equity to others doing policy work
- 2. We must offer different levels of engagement for youth to choose from long term planning to single time engagement
- 3. We must be willing to pivot, to take on policy ideas we are unsure of how to operationalize, and step back from policy ideas that are not supported by those with lived expertise

Lessons Learned from Community Engagement

- We have to hold the space for people to envision transformation even when we are in times of crisis
- 2. We will disagree and we have to continue to build coalition while stay rooted in values and the demands of young people
- We have to provide the tools to communities to take this work to a local level and to use it alongside the national movement



Housing Justice Pillar Overview





Action 1

ACTION

Abolish the need for congregate shelters by creating crisis housing that meets the needs of

youth and young adults

RESULT

- There are no longer shelters.
- Any young person has access to immediate (same day) access to crisis housing of choice that offers privacy, dignity, and safety.
- Crisis housing leads to long-term housing of their choice within 30 days.

No shelters means no longer using facilitates that lack private
 rooms/units without access to places to cook, provide for self
 hygiene, secure belongings, and access 24 hours.





Transformative Efforts

A robust and coordinated youth and family prevention system

Direct cash transfer to young people, with optional housing navigation services

Immediate
access to
emergency
housing vouchers
without eligibility
restrictions or

Action 2

ACTION

Make housing an entitlement for youth and young adults under 30 through rental assistance, dedicated affordable housing units, and homeownership support.

RESULT

- All youth and young adults under 30 have access to a variety of housing subsidies, including homeownership supports and family-based services
- Safe, accessible housing of their choice at less than 30% of their total annual income.





Transformative Efforts

A full-scale federal investment in the rehabilitation and production of affordable and accessible housing units and homes

A dedicated housing voucher program not restricted by eligibility or prioritization requirements and without time-limits or income requirements or restrictions

Direct cash transfer to young people, with optional housing navigation services

Laws that allow for youth under the age of 18 to live independently in housing of their choice





Transformative Efforts

Re-creation of local land use and zoning regulations to address systemic racism

Action 3

ACTION

Make the supports youth need an entitlement and have the systems and services governed by, an in collaboration with Black, Brown, Indigenous and LGBTQ communities to meet youth's employment, education, transportation, and health needs.

RESULT

All youth have access to:

- affordable, quality physical and mental health care from providers that look like them;
- employment & entrepreneurship opportunities that pay a living wage and universal basic income when not employed;
- free education and job training opportunities; and
- accessible transportation.
