### Mikvah (Ritual Pool)

The Community Mikvah of Jewish Silicon Valley opened its doors in January 2008 and now welcomes visitors from around the Bay Area. Located at the Levy Family Campus in Los Gatos, its sparkling, kosher pool provides Jews with an experience of ritual immersion that can be a source of spiritual renewal, celebration and healing. We honor the full diversity of the Jewish community.

We welcome those visiting the Mikvah for traditional reasons like: married women immersing monthly (niddah/taharat ha-mishpacha), getting married, making dishes kosher, conversion, and preparing spiritually for Shabbat and holidays. Equally welcome and encouraged are creative reasons to immerse, such as to celebrate a major life transition or change in status. Examples of this type of visit might include reaching a milestone birthday, acknowledging a diagnosis or recovery from illness, marking the end of a mourning period, becoming a bar/bat mitzvah, coming out, or celebrating an anniversary.

#### Addison-Penzak JCC, Los Gatos www.apjcc.org

Be'chol Lashon brings the historic Jewish commitment to civil rights and racial justice forward into the 21st century. We cannot be truly effective in impacting social and racial justice until we address race inside the Jewish community. Hasidah (Hebrew for "stork") provides assistance to Jews of all backgrounds who are experiencing infertility and other family-building challenges. Hasidah's mission is to build Jewish families by providing people emotional and spiritual support, offering financial assistance for IVF treatment, and building awareness and sensitivity about infertility and its effects.

#### Hebrew Free Loan hflasf.org

A nonprofit that provides interest-free loans to help Jewish individuals in Northern California overcome financial challenges and pursue life dreams. Loans are also available to those in Northern California who meet one of the following criteria, regardless of religious background: Immediate family member or business partner of a Jewish individual; Employee of a Jewish organization; Student from a lower income home who is referred by a partner agency. As loans are repaid, funds are recycled to make new loans. We've proven the success of this model with a repayment rate over 99%.

JFS SV provides a broad range of social services to help people thrive. The agency's programs are available without regard to race, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation, or ability to pay.




#### Becoming a Soulful Parent: A Path to the Wisdom Within (2021) - Dasee Berkowitz

This book will help you ground your floating anxieties about the state of the world outside, while giving you the tools to reflect on the state of your world. It will help strengthen "muscles" that will be essential for you and your children throughout your lives—muscles like love, listening, empathy, and curiosity. Combining insights from thousands of years of traditional Jewish wisdom with the author's relatable first-person storytelling, this book will help you lean into the challenges of parenting with renewed perspective and enthusiasm.




#### Pirkei Imahot: The Wisdom of Mothers, The Voices of Women (2017) -Lois Sussman Shenker and Rabbi Eve Posen

Through the authors' and contributors' experiences as women, mothers, leaders and teachers in their community, the reader will gain wisdom on how to live morally within her community, how to participate in tikkun olam, [the repair of the world] and how to strengthen her leadership roles to make a difference. Casting Lots: Creating a Family in a Beautiful, Broken World (2016) - Rabbi Susan Silverman Susan Silverman grew up with parents who were, both before and after a devastating loss, atheists. Yet, as a young adult, she shocked everyone who knew her and became a rabbi. Silverman then built her own big, unwieldy family through both birth and adoption, something she had intended from childhood. This unique family becomes a metaphor for the world's contradictions and complexities - a microcosm of the tragedy and joy, hope and despair, cruelty and compassion, predictability and absurdity of this world we all live in.






How To Raise A Jewish Child: A Practical Handbook for Family Life (2008) -Anita Diamant and Karen Kushner
