University High School Performing Fine Arts Magnet Program

The goal of University High School's Performing Fine Arts Magnet Program is to foster students' artistic, academic, and personal development through a rigorous, performance-based curriculum in dance, instrumental, vocal, and theatrical arts. Students will be held to high academic and artistic standards while fostering an atmosphere of mutual respect, collaboration, support, and acceptance. Program students will actively engage in the local community, demonstrating integrity, leadership, and service, while delivering world-class performances.

The Magnet Program will support an intense student achievement focus, both academically and artistically, using the specific track course progression listed in this handbook. Students will engage in reviews and recitals that mirror accredited collegiate systems. The Program will also offer trips to colleges and universities as UHS personnel guide students through the auditions and the application process for admission into postsecondary institutions.

The PFA Magnet is an unique educational program for which the student has met specific and stringent admission requirements. It is a privilege to be a magnet student, a privilege which demands the highest efforts. The student enrollment in the program is contingent upon maintaining the high expectations of an arts magnet student. These expectations are outlined in this handbook.

It is important that students and parent/guardians take special care to read and understand the contents of this handbook, for it contains the regulations and requirements to which the student will be held accountable. Further questions about the program should be directed to the appropriate program coordinator listed.

Tutoring

Students on probation are encouraged to ask their instructors for extra help for classes in which they are experiencing difficulty.

Parental Support

Quality education is the result of a joint effort on the part of students, teachers, and parents; all three are essential. Our program and students need parent support and encouragement. Teachers may be contacted by phone or e-mail. If needed, parents may contact their child's guidance counselor to make an appointment with a teacher; teachers are not available for unscheduled meetings during the school day. Parents are encouraged to become involved by assisting with fund-raising activities and serving as chaperones on field trips. County policy mandates that all parents who chaperone field trips register as ADDITIONS volunteers.

Tracks, Curriculum, and Courses

The Program's four-year course progression is similar to a four-year postsecondary program in the arts. The Program has an increased emphasis on the respective area of study in order for students to refine the knowledge and performing skills needed to continue in the arts at the postsecondary level. One of the unique opportunities that the PFA Magnet at UHS provides is a balanced curriculum of academics and performing arts classes. With three performing arts magnet classes and four academic classes, our curriculum has been set up for the students' maximum success not only in high school, but also in their college careers or respective art industries. There are four tracks to choose from - Dance, Instrumental, Theatre and Vocal with opportunities to specialize within each track. For instance in the Instrumental track one can specialize and structure their magnet to be a Keyboard, Orchestra or Guitar Track. Our goal is to make sure you get the Arts and Academic education you need. The Program will have counselors to guide students and parents/guardians through the students' curriculum choices, their individual tracks and the magnet.

PFA POLICIES

Requirements for Active Status in PFA Magnet

- 1. Proper completion of application, audition, and interview
- 2. Enrollment in appropriate level PFA courses. PFA courses must be taken on the UHS campus from an UHS instructor.
- 3. Attendance at concerts, recitals, performances of respective track.
- 4. 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 unweighted scale for each NINE WEEK grading period (UHS courses only) and a *B* or better in PFA courses each grading period
- 5. Attendance at quarterly PFA recitals (Only one absence permitted)
- 6. Good attendance and exemplary behavior record.
- 7. Magnet students are encouraged to participate in extra-curricular activities. However, if a conflict occurs, the PFA activity takes precedence.

Probation Policy

A student enrolled in the PFA Magnet Program will have the following expectations:

- 1. PFAM students will maintain a 2.5 GPA (unweighted) on a 4.0 scale for each nine-week grading period.
- 2. PFAM students will earn a grade higher than a C in a PFA class for each nine-week grading period.
- 3. PFAM will attend all but 1 PFA afternoon recital.
- 4. We expect our PFAM students to be outstanding citizens for the Magnet, School and District.

Notification of Probation

- 1. Student grades will be monitored each nine-week grading period.
- 2. Students and Parents are responsible for monitoring student status.
- 3. A courtesy letter of notification will be sent to parents the first time a student falls below the grade requirements. The parent/guardian and student will be asked to sign and return the letter to the PFA office by the date stated but the probation IS NOT contingent upon the return of the signed letter. Probation will be in place whether the letter is returned as requested or not.
- 4. If a student allows his/her grades to fall a second time, they will be placed on CONTRACT. A meeting will be set for the parent, student, PFA Coordinator and the AP over magnet programs. During this meeting, the parent and student will sign and date the contract. This contract will state that if the student falls out of compliance again during any nine week grading period, the student will be dismissed from the program without an opportunity to appeal.
- 5. After being placed on contract, if a student falls out of compliance a third time they will be dismissed from the magnet program. The student will be notified when he/she has been dismissed but will not be removed from magnet classes or University High School (if not zoned for UHS), until the end of the school year. Once again, *there is no appeal process.* The Magnet Administrator & Coordinator will consider extreme circumstances at the recommendation of magnet teachers.

Removal from PFA Magnet

Any Level IV offense will result in immediate removal from the program. Traditionally, removal from magnet status takes place at the end of the school year (semester dismissal is an option). Removal will result in the following:

- 1. If a student is not part of the University High school district, he/she will be returned to his/her home school. A letter will be sent notifying the parents and school that the student will be returning to the home school.
- 2. If a student is part of the University High school district, he/she will be removed from magnet classes.
