Greetings!

On behalf of the University of Minnesota School of Music and the Minnesota Guitar Society, we would like to invite you to attend the 2019 Mid-America Guitar Ensemble Festival. The event will be held on the University of Minnesota campus March 29-31, 2019, in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The Mid-America Guitar Ensemble Festival is an annual event hosted by different colleges and universities throughout the region. It was established in 1991 to foster camaraderie and pedagogical exchanges between classical guitar teachers and students; to provide performance and learning opportunities for student ensembles; and to contribute to the overall artistic and cultural enrichment of classical guitar ensemble audiences. The Festival also has worked to increase the ensemble repertoire by commissioning pieces for the festival orchestra. The first festival was hosted by Millikin University in Decatur, IL, and since has been sponsored by schools in Illinois, Missouri, Michigan, and Indiana.

The weekend will consist of performances by participating guitar ensembles, masterclasses, and a concert by this year's guest artists, the Tantalus Quartet. The festival guitar orchestra will perform the world premier of Guido Sanchez-Portuguez' composition "Passages" commissioned for this festival. Mr. Sanchez-Portuguez will join us to direct rehearsals and conduct the performance.

Masterclasses, rehearsals and the concerts by ensembles from participating institutions will take place at the University of Minnesota School of Music. Vendors offering guitars, accessories and printed music will be on the U of MN campus throughout the duration of the festival.

About Guido Sanchez-Portuguez

Guido began his musical studies at the University of Costa Rica's School of Music where he graduated with honors in 2001 under the guidance of Mario Solera. In 2004, he began his Master's at Indiana University Jacobs School of Music with the distinguished professor and internationally acclaimed guitarist Ernesto Bitetti. Guido continued on to the prestigious Doctoral Program at the Jacobs School of Music, graduating in May 2012 as Doctor of Music in Guitar with minors in Music Theory and Composition where he studied with composers Luis Diego Herra, Sven-David Sandstrom, Per Martensson, Gabriela Ortiz, and Don Freund.

Guido has been invited to participate in numerous festivals around the world including the Boardwalk Music Festival in Virginia, the Festival de Guitares D'Alsace in France, the Festival Internacional de Guitarra in San José, Costa Rica, the Festival de Guitarra de Guanacaste in Liberia, Costa Rica, Guitar Days in Buffalo, NY, the Festival Permanente de Música de Suchitoto in El Salvador and the Indiana Guitar Festival. He has also performed and given



masterclasses and lecture-recitals at several universities including Marshall University, Universidad de Costa Rica, Tulane University, University of Illinois, Indiana University, University of Indianapolis and Indiana University Purdue in Indianapolis, IN.

Guido is currently the guitar lecturer at the University of Illinois School of Music. He continues to compose, as well as perform both locally and internationally.

About Tantalus Quartet

Tantalus Quartet has dazzled audiences across the globe with their warm stage presence, their "perfect ensemble" (Reinischer Post, Germany), and their "strong, nuanced and textured performance[s] with compelling dynamics and a beautiful sound" (Julia Crowe, Classical Guitar). Tantalus expands the boundaries of the traditional guitar quartet with new music by award-winning composers, "clever and well-chosen" arrangements, and "diverse and original" programming (Richard Long, Soundboard).




Tantalus has continued this tradition with their second CD

release: Foolish Fire, which features world-premiere recordings of Edie Hill's *Above the Green Night*, Apostolos Paraskevas' *Feast*, and Kristian Anderson's *Foolish Fire*. The Quartet's CD Debut received rave reviews from critics: "The range of dynamics on this disc is unmatched in the genre. [Tantalus Quartet is] breaking new ground in terms of their aesthetic. The angst is back." (Andrew Hull, Rosewood Review).

Tantalus maintains an active performing schedule, and has appeared at important concert series and festivals throughout the United States, Europe, and Canada, including Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall, the Guitar Foundation of America Convention, the University of Louisville Guitar Festival, the Columbus State University Guitar Symposium, the New York Guitar Seminar (U.S.A.), the Troubadour Series, the Mostly Music Series Chicago, Iserlohn International Guitar Symposium (Germany), Silesian Guitar Autumn (Poland), Acadia International Guitar Festival (Canada), and many others.
