CHRISTMAS IS COMING!

But for some, Christmas can be a sad time. Many people struggle to put food on the table, much less gifts under the tree. Under the Tree, Inc. (formerly known as the Hampton Christmas Store) is a nonprofit organization whose goal is to provide a unique Christmas shopping experience while preserving dignity. Pre-qualified parents actually shop for their kids' "new" toys in a store we set up for the day. They buy their gifts with a very minimal fee (last year they were allowed to spend up to \$5 per child which gave them about \$100 worth of toys) to allow them to invest in their family's Christmas.

The Christmas store provides a family experience with gift wrapping, parents shopping, kids shopping in their own store and of course pictures with Santa. We have found that this keeps their dignity intact. It's a hand up, not a hand out. We have been able to develop many relationships through the last few years and have the opportunity to show Jesus' love.

This year we will have to provide for over 250 kids. We need toys!!! If you can help, please donate a new, unwrapped toy (with the price tag left on please!), or monetary donations by December 7th. We are a 501(c)3 and can provide a tax receipt upon request. Our Christmas store will be held December 9 at Hampton Baptist Church. SENIOR SAFETY TIPS FROM MENNOWOOD RETIREMENT COMMUNITY

Always be on the lookout for ways to keep yourself safe. Crime and the fear of crime create special problems for the elderly. Crime prevention is everyone's responsibility, not just a job for law enforcement. Seniors can learn how to protect themselves from crime by following these simple, commonsense suggestions.

Let's start when we are in our homes. Always lock your doors and windows and never open the door without checking to see who is there. Keep your home well lit at night, inside and out; keep curtains closed. Use your "Neighborhood Watch" to keep an eye on your neighborhood. When you leave don't leave notes on your door saying to leave a package in the back. Also let your neighbors know when you are leaving so they can keep a watch on your home. Cancel deliveries such as newspapers. Be wary of unsolicited offers to make repairs to your home. Ask for proper identification from delivery person or strangers. Never let a stranger in your home. Deal only with reputable businesses. Keep an inventory with serial numbers and photographs of re-saleable appliances, antiques and furniture. Finally, don't hide your keys under the mat or in other conspicuous places. If you arrive at home and suspect a stranger may be inside, DON'T GO IN. Leave quietly and call 911 to report the crime.

This time of year we may be out more shopping due to the weather. So when you are walking to and from a building carry a whistle on your key chain so you can make as much noise as possible if you are attacked on the street. Avoid going out alone at night, have a companion accompany you. If traveling in your car, don't leave your purse on the seat beside you; put it on the floor, where it is more difficult for someone to grab it. Keep your purse close to you and don't dangle it from your arm (Twelve percent of all crimes against elderly are purse snatchings and street robberies.) Never leave your purse unattended or in a shopping cart. Try to carry as little cash as possible and definitely don't display large sums of cash. Lock your bags in the trunk and not on the seat. When returning to your car check the front and back seat before entering. Walk in well-lighted areas and have your keys ready when you approach your car or home.

Just some other reminders, criminals know exactly when government checks arrive each month and may pick that day to attack. Avoid this by using Direct Deposit or choosing another day to go to the bank. Never give your money to someone who calls on you, identifying himself as a bank official.

Mennowood is constantly looking at ways to keep our seniors safe. This year we added security code entrance key pads for our residents and families to have quick access into the building without having to use keys to enter the building. Mennowood also added more lighting to our parking areas to keep our seniors safe. In December, we sponsored a Senior Safety class for safe shopping for the Holidays. Valerie Young, MPO, Virginia State Certified Crime Prevention Specialist with the Newport News Police Department came and spoke to our community which was open to the public on how to stay safe while shopping.
