Introduction: Bill 9-18, Child Care – Ready to Learn Initiative - Established

Bill 9-18, Child Care – Ready to Learn Initiative - Established, sponsored by Lead Sponsor Council President Riemer, is scheduled to be introduced on March 13, 2018. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for April 3, at 7:30 p.m.
