## Can someone receive both HSP and CARES-RRP funding?

Yes, but only if each of the funding sources cover different months. City residency requirements apply for HSP funding.

## Can someone apply for both the HSP program and the HSP Eviction Prevention Program?

No, under HSP guidelines, a household is eligible for up to \$3,000 total in a five year period. Renters <u>without</u> an eviction appeals should apply for HSP. Those <u>with</u> an eviction appeal filed with the Housing Court should apply for the Eviction Prevention Program.
