THE APOSTLE'S CREED

Officiant Show us your mercy, O Lord; People And grant us your salvation.

Officiant Clothe your ministers with righteousness;

People Let your people sing with joy.

Officiant Give peace, O Lord, in all the world;

People For only in you can we live in safety.

Officiant Lord, keep this nation under your care;

People And guide us in the way of justice and truth.

Officiant Let your way be known upon earth;
 People Your saving health among all nations.
 Officiant Let not the needy, O Lord, be forgotten;
 People Nor the hope of the poor be taken away.

Officiant Create in us clean hearts, O God;

People And sustain us with your Holy Spirit.

THE COLLECTS

Silence is kept.

The Officiant reads several collects, and after each the people respond: Amen.

THE ANTHEM
